- District Visioning Summit-May 1, 2014, 8:30am-4pm at Royal Colwood Golf Club-facilitators have been going out to the community to gather stories to learn of powerful learning moments in peoples lives-the summit will involve reading the stories and finding the underlying themes-the district is going to use these themes to help strengthen the learning process in our district-an invitation was extended to the group, please RSVP through the link on the district site
- 3600 out of 7000 students will be transitioning to new schools in 2015 when the new schools open
- The district has been working on decreasing its budget due to less monies being provided by the government in the coming year-the district is paid so much per student from the government to operate its budget-wages for district employees take up most of the budget-it was explained how the government provides buffers for schools whose enrollment is decreasing, but districts whose enrollment is increasing doesn't receive extra benefits

- praise was given to the district for being able to maintain great working relationships during rough times
- Bob quoted Jerome Kagan, renowned child psychologist when speaking of the biology and environment of the cycle of children growing to be parents and grandparents and how it relates to our education system-a statement of how do we best support our children, school connectedness

• BCCUPE convention had more resolutions presented this year than in previous years-Tim spoke of the Federal Health Accord and how medical user fees will be increased due to a short fall that will happen if accord is passed-Tim also reported how increasing CPP contributions, CPP could be doubled-mental health care was pushed aside and an independent financial advisor has to investigate-Tim spoke of Temporary Foreign Workers and how they should be hired for specific jobs that require special training, not of low entry jobs such as fast food

• Students of upper grades are willing to be involved with PACs or SPEAC, they just need direction-students have ideas to share and haven't been able to share them with adult groups such as PAC-it was recognized that students are involved in the district visioning process and the newly created student leadership council
