Question-is there going to be a split between the new schools where one school will be focused on academics and the other life skills programs Answer-no, both schools will offer high academic programs **Question**-Will the resources to elementary schools be cut and given to the higher grades? Answer-the funding will be the same for the whole district

Question-Completion Days-the last 3 days of school, in Middle schools, dedicated to complete incomplete projects-Answer-junior high schools use to have exams on those days and it has been replaced with completion days
