Inaugural Board Meeting

November 1, 2022 Agenda Item: 10.1 – Oath of Office

Background

- Based on Section 50 of the School Act (copied below), all persons elected as a trustee must take the
 prescribed Oath of Office (attached) within the time limits identified in the Act
- This Oath of Office will be made before the District's Secretary Treasurer during the Inaugural Meeting of the Board of Education (BoE) on November 1, 2022
- Easy trustee elect will take the Oath individually
- Once all seven trustees have taken the oath, they will be deemed to have officially taken office and will form the Board of Education for School District #62 (Sooke) for the 2022 to 2026 term

Oath of office

- 50 (1) A person elected or appointed as a trustee must make a prescribed oath of office, by oath or solemn affirmation, within the following applicable time limit:
 - (a) in the case of a person elected by acclamation, within 50 days after the date set for general voting day had an election by voting been required;
 - (b) in the case of a person elected by voting, within 45 days after the declaration of the results of the election;
 - (c) in the case of a person appointed to office, within 45 days after the effective date of the appointment.
 - (2) The oath must be made before a judge of the Court of Appeal, Supreme Court or Provincial Court, a justice of the peace, a local government corporate officer or the secretary treasurer of a board, and the person making the oath must obtain the completed oath or a certificate of it from the person administering it.
 - (3) A person takes office as trustee
 - (a) at the time the term of office begins if, at this time, the person produces or has produced the completed oath or certificate to the secretary treasurer, or
 - (b) at any later time that the person produces the completed oath or certificate to the secretary treasurer.
 - (4) A person taking office as a trustee may also make an oath of allegiance.

Inaugural Board Meeting

November 1, 2022 Agenda Item: 10.2 – Trustee Elections

Background

- Once the Board of Education (BoE) has been formed, the first order of business is to conduct trustee elections to determine the following positions:
 - 1) Chair of the Board;
 - 2) Vice-Chair of the Board;
 - 3) British Columbia School Trustee Association (BCSTA) Representative and Alternate; and
 - 4) British Columbia Public School Employees Association (BCPSEA) Representative and Alternate.
- The role and responsibilities of the Board Chair and Vice Chair are outlined on the <u>Board's Bylaw #1-20</u>
- To begin the election process, the Secretary Treasurer will conduct the election of the Board Chair
- After the Board Chair has been elected or acclaimed, the meeting and remainder of the trustee elections will be turned over to the Chair to conduct
- During non-Board of Education/Municipal election years, the trustee election process is conducted during the regular December Board meeting
